

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION CONSENTING TO THE CITY OF DERBY'S ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NORTH GATEWAY REDEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the City of Derby, Kansas, acting pursuant to the authority of K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 12-1770, *et seq.*, held a public hearing on December 6, 2011 to consider the establishment of the North Gateway Redevelopment District; and,

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 12-1771(d) provides that no privately owned property subject to ad valorem taxes shall be acquired and redeveloped under the provisions of K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 12-1770 *et seq.*, if the board of county commissioners levying taxes on such property determines by resolution adopted within 30 days following the conclusion of the hearing for the establishment of the redevelopment district that the proposed redevelopment district will have an adverse effect on the county; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Sedgwick County Commissioners, after due consideration of the proposed redevelopment district, determines that the North Gateway Redevelopment District, as proposed by the City of Derby, does not have an adverse effect on Sedgwick County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SEDGWICK COUNTY, KANSAS, that:

SECTION I. The North Gateway Redevelopment District as proposed by the City of Derby does not have an adverse effect on Sedgwick County and the Board of Sedgwick County Commissioners hereby consents to its establishment.
