<p><u>Chronic Disease Risk Reduction (CDRR) (#2):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) Health Promotion Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • By June 30, 2013, increase the proportion of callers to the Quit line that report they are pregnant by 10%. • By June 30, 2013, 3% of multi-unit family dwellings in Sedgwick County will have smoke-free policies. • By June 30, 2013, promote the new Kansas Tobacco Quit line web services and resources to clinics and student health centers (college campuses) serving youth and young adults in Sedgwick County to increase the number utilizing Quit line services to 20. (Baseline 2011: 0 enrolled since it was just released) • By June 30, 2013, promote and increase utilization along the Wichita Arkansas River Path by 5%. (Baseline = Arkansas River Path utilization between April 2010-June 2010 = approximately 15,430 individual uses.)
<p><u>Family Planning (#5):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) Family Planning 2) Laboratory Services</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • By June 30, 2013, provide family planning services to 3,264 unduplicated users. • By June 30, 2013, increase the number of high-risk (age 19 & under) users receiving services from 398 in Calendar Year (CY) 2012 to 399 in (CY) 2013. • By June 30, 2013, increase the number of low-income (below 150% poverty) users receiving services from 2950 in CY 2012 to 2951 in CY 2013.
<p><u>STD Intervention & Prevention (#15):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) STD Control Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • By June 30, 2013, conduct an intensive disease intervention interview on at least 80 percent of all cases of syphilis within seven days of initiation to the field. • During the Calendar year 2012, DIS will interview 75% of the new HIV infections within 14 days. • By June 30, 2013, examine at least 70 percent of all new, locatable, in jurisdiction sexual partners of Chlamydia and gonorrhea cases within three days from the date of initiation.
<p><u>AIDS-STD Intervention & Prevention (#16):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) STD Control Program 2) Laboratory Services</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • By June 30, 2013, perform the same assay as the Kansas Division of Health and Environmental laboratories for Chlamydia and gonorrhea testing and report the findings on the appropriate forms quarterly and yearly. • By June, 30, 2013, submit quarterly, a minimum data set in the necessary format on all persons tested for Chlamydia and gonorrhea by the local agency. All data will be in accordance with the Kansas infertility Prevention Project (KIPP) specifications and submitted within seven days of the end of the quarter. • STD Intervention and Prevention: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Interview 80% of gonorrhea and 80% of Chlamydia cases within three days. ○ Interview 70% of syphilis cases within 7 days. ○ Examine 70% of gonorrhea and Chlamydia contacts within three days. ○ Examine 70% of all syphilis cases within 7 days. ○ Investigate and close 80% of all Chlamydia, 80% of all gonorrhea and 80% syphilis reactors within seven days. ○ Initiate an average of 1.0 contact for each Chlamydia and gonorrhea case interviewed. ○ Initiate an average of 2.0 contacts for each syphilis case interviewed. • HIV Intervention and Prevention: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Interview 75% of new HIV infections within 14 days

<p><u>Maternal & Child Health (#17):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) Healthy Babies 2) Children’s Dental Clinic 3) Laboratory Services</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increase the percentage of pregnant women, infants, children and adolescents who have access to a "Medical Home" (regular source of care & identified payer source) from 80% to 90% by 06-30-13. (886/985 ~ all MCH programs) • Increase the percentage of delivered clients served by the MCH local agency that initiate breastfeeding from 80% to 83% by 06-30-13. (124/150 ~ all programs) • Reduce child and adolescent risk behaviors relating to alcohol, tobacco and other drugs by providing comprehensive screening and preconception and interconceptional counseling to 80% of adolescents served by the MCH local agency. (220/275 ~ all programs) • In the clinical setting, 80% of women who receive a positive pregnancy test will receive comprehensive screening and prenatal counseling with referrals to a prenatal care provider. (184/230 ~ all programs)
<p><u>HIV Opt Out (#20):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) STD Clinic</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • By June 30, 2013, Test and treat 3200 STI encounters (presenting with symptoms and/or exposures to STI's). • By June 30, 2013, increase the proportion of HIV post-test counseling client notification status rate from 37% up to 75%. Current outcome for CY2011 is 50%.
<p><u>Personal Responsibility Education Preparation (PREP) (#24):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) Healthy Babies</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HB staffs will co-facilitate the RTR curriculum at the two new high schools (South and Southeast) during the fall of 2012, along with the physical education teachers from those schools that will attend RTR training in summer 2012. • By June 30, 2013, pre and post evaluation will be done at all four high schools including a 90 day post evaluation. • programming has been implemented in two USD 259 high schools (Northwest and Heights). During summer 2012, Healthy Babies staffs will provide training to the PE teachers at Northwest, Heights, South, and Southeast High Schools. Northwest and Heights teachers will be facilitating the Reducing the Risk (RTR) curriculum in their own classrooms during the fall of 2012.
<p><u>Immunization Action Plan (#34):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) Immunizations Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The SCHD will implement a monthly client reminder system for clients who receive the HPV vaccine through the SCHD by June 30, 2013. • The SCHD will provide at least one education presentation annually to school nurses and/or juvenile correctional facility staff by June 30, 2013. • By June 30, 2013, the SCHD will assure lifespan immunization services for individuals of all ages within the SCHD's jurisdiction by providing adolescent immunization services via our mobile clinic in a combination of at least 10 middle and high schools within Sedgwick County.
<p><u>WIC Immunization Action Plan (#35):</u></p> <p>Health Department Programs: 1) Immunizations Program 2) Women, Infant & Children’s (WIC) Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The WIC/IAP nurse will conduct and/or provide at least four immunization in-services/training activities annually for WIC staff by June 30, 2013. • The Sedgwick County Health Department will employ a team, WIC/IAP Nurse and clerical assistant, to provide a linkage between WIC and immunization services by providing immunization services at all WIC locations in Wichita at least three times a month by June 30, 2013. • The SCHD will host a "Back to School Immunization Clinic" and work to increase accessibility to vaccinations by waiving administration fees for uninsured Head start/school age WIC clients as well as other children in Sedgwick County who attend the clinic by June 30, 2013.
