On the recommendation of Joe Thomas, on behalf of Public Works, David Spears moved to **accept the low bid from Mies Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$46,478.30**. Linda Kizzire seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The Greenwich Plaza addition involves the construction of stormwater drainage improvements including pond and channel construction, grading, and seeding.

This is a special assessment project with 100% of the costs to be charged to the benefit district with nothing to be paid by the County-at-large. Therefore, the County is not bound by the engineer's estimate.

However, since the original petition did not sufficiently cover the estimated total cost of the project based on the lowest construction bid received on August 28th, a re-petition was filed and was accepted and signed by 100% of the owners of the total liable area. A resolution amending and supplementing the original resolution was approved by the BoCC on September 26th.

**2. EMC AVAMAR LEASE AGREEMENT - DIVISION OF INFORMATION AND OPERATIONS  
FUNDING-NETWORKING AND TELECOM**

On the recommendation of Angee Sisco, on behalf of the Division of Information and Operations, Linda Kizzire moved to **accept the agreement from EMC in the amount of \$110,987.00 per year for three (3) years for a total cost of \$332,961.00.** David Spears seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Our current backup system (Avamar) is in need of a hardware upgrade. It is running on what is called "Generation 3" hardware which will soon become obsolete. Once this happens, the old system is no longer supported by EMC and the County will not be able to obtain software updates or patches. This lease agreement will allow us to upgrade our current equipment and pay for the cost of maintenance and support to cover the leased equipment over the next three years.

The current annual support renewals for Avamar increase annually. The renewal for 2013 is expected to be \$110,000. For any successive qualifying terms, a 10% increase each year is estimated. A lease agreement in place for three years for the Generation 4 hardware would save around \$34,000 over the next three years, while also avoiding a large hardware purchase and resolving the issue of not being able to apply software upgrades.
