

RESOLUTION NO. ____ - ____

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE APPLICABILITY OF THE KANSAS PERSONAL AND FAMILY PROTECTION ACT TO COUNTY-OWNED AND COUNTY-LEASED REAL PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Kansas Bill of Rights provides, in part, that a person has the right to keep and bear arms for the defense of self, family, home and state, and the United States Supreme Court has upheld the individual right to keep and bear arms; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas has enacted the Personal and Family Protection Act (K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 75-7c01, *et seq.*, hereinafter referred to as “the Act”); and,

WHEREAS, the Act restricts carrying concealed handguns on certain premises which are conspicuously posted in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the Kansas Attorney General; and,

WHEREAS, the Act permits persons licensed thereunder to carry a concealed handgun within a building or buildings of counties whenever such building or buildings are not posted with appropriate notice; and

WHEREAS, the Sedgwick County Board of County Commissioners previously adopted Resolution No. 172-2011, regarding the applicability of the Kansas Personal and Family Protection Act to County-owned and County-leased real property; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has adopted, and the Governor has signed, Senate Substitute for House Bill 2052 (the Bill) which addresses carrying of concealed handguns by persons, including members of the public and County employees, in municipal buildings; and

WHEREAS, the Bill applies to municipal buildings, which are defined as buildings owned or leased by the County, but such term does not include buildings leased by the County to a private entity, or a building owned by the County solely for reasons of revenue bond financing; and

WHEREAS, the Bill takes effect on July 1, 2013; and

WHEREAS, in order for certain County owned or leased municipal buildings to be exempt from the Bill until January 1, 2014, notice must be provided to the Attorney General and each local law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over any of the buildings owned or leased by the County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF SEDGWICK COUNTY, KANSAS that:

SECTION 1. Buildings identified in “Exhibit A” (which is attached and incorporated herein by reference) are exempt from Senate Substitute for House Bill 2052 until January 1, 2014, and shall be conspicuously posted with signs as provided in K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 75-7c10(f), and persons licensed under the Act shall be prohibited from carrying a concealed handgun into any of such buildings; except to the extent otherwise provided for by law or County policies.

SECTION 2. Except for the buildings identified in Section 1 hereof, every County “municipal building,” as that term is defined by Senate Substitute for House Bill 2052, existing or acquired after the adoption of this resolution, shall not be posted with signs as provided K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 75-7c10(f). Persons licensed under the Act shall be permitted to carry a concealed handgun into any of such municipal buildings. Concealed carry of handguns into other County owned or leased buildings, including any municipal buildings as that term is defined by HB 2052, will be subject to whether those building entrances are posted to the extent the prohibition of carrying of concealed handguns is not otherwise restricted by any other law.

SECTION 3. A cover letter and copy of this resolution shall be sent to the Attorney General and to each local law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over any of the buildings owned or leased by the County to provide the notice required under Section 2(i) of Senate Substitute for House Bill 2052.

SECTION 4. Resolution No. 172-2011 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This Resolution shall become effective upon its approval and passage by the governing body of Sedgwick County, Kansas.
