THE BEL AIRE TREE BOARD WISHES TO HONOR THE WOMEN AND MEN OF THE SEDGWICK COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT WHO DAILY RISK THEIR LIVES TO SAVE THE LIVES AND PROPERTY OF COUNTY RESIDENTS THREATENED BY FIRE OR OTHER CATASTROPHIC EVENTS. WE WISH TO PLANT A SURVIVOR TREE SAPLING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF FIRE STATION NUMBER 37. THIS TREE WAS GROWN FROM A SEED FROM THE NATIVE AMERICAN ELM THAT SURVIVED THE BLAST FROM THE MURRAH BUILDING ON 4-19-1995 WHERE 168 MEN WOMEN AND CHILDREN WERE KILLED.

THE TREE WAS IMPALED WITH SHRAPNEL FROM
THE EXPLOSION AND WAS SCHEDULED TO BE CUT
DOWN, WHEN BEFORE THAT EVENT IT PUT FORTH
BUDS AND WAS OBVIOUSLY ALIVE. IT IS OVER 100
YEARS OLD AND IS NOW THE BEST CARED FOR
TREE IN THE UNITED STATES AND IS NOW PART OF
A NATIONAL MEMORIAL. THE CITY OF BEL AIRE
WOULD CONSIDER IT AN HONOR TO DONATE AND
PLANT THIS TREE ON YOUR SITE.
