



#### **Types of JIAC Intakes 2012 - present**




Intakes to JDF are Pass Throughs in which the juvenile is being detained on a writ, warrant, etc.

# Placement Dispositions 2013 - present




Placement disposition in detention occurs after the intake and assessment is complete, and it has been determined that the juvenile needs to be detained.




### Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF) Admissions

#### JDF ADP: 2012 - present






# JDF Length of Stay & Cost





- Juvenile Probation operated by District Court




### Juvenile Intensive Supervision (JISP) ADP: 2012 - present






