KDHE Opioid Overdose Crisis Response Grant Application	
Purpose:	Enhance the capacity of Sedgwick County partners to respond to opioid misuse and overdose through improved prevention efforts. Funds must be used for community-based coordination and development, implementation, and evaluation of activities that address prevention of opioid-related morbidity and mortality. Activities performed under this proposal will benefit prevention of other drug misuse, as well.
	 Proposed activities include the following: Perform high-level community needs assessment related to drug misuse, abuse and overdose, focusing on prevention around opioid use disorder and opioid overdose.
	 Provide trainings for medical providers, other healthcare professionals and others in the community Implement an evidence-based screening tool at a clinic to identify a patient's risk for misuse of alcohol and drugs. The risk identified by using the tool determines the action to take by the medical provider for the patient. Evaluate the effectiveness of the screening tool implementation and the trainings. Create a toolkit for screening tool implementation in other clinics.
	 Add mental health partners to the soon-to-be implemented, local Integrated Referral and Intake System (IRIS) software system so that community partners can easily refer individuals to mental health agencies. Utilize existing local drug misuse data to: Create public facing webpage (DITSS is involved), Identify and map overdose "hot spots", Create action plan for prevention.
	 Collect local drug misuse data from new local partners and develop data sharing and data use agreements. Learn prevention strategies and best practices by travel for one person to the <i>National Rx Drug Abuse and Heroin Summit</i>, Atlanta, GA, April 22-25, 2019.

Utilization continued:	 Travel for one person to the National Rx Drug Abuse and Heroin Summit, Atlanta, GA, April 22-25, 2019. Sub-grant award to University of Kansas School of Medicine-Wichita for full coordination of two half-day trainings for medical providers, SBIRT-certified physician trainer, and technical assistance in performing clinical workflow studies.
