

# 2018 – 2019 Kansas Department of Health & Environment (KDHE) Opioid Overdose Crisis Response

## Application Overview for the Sedgwick County Division of Health

<b>KDHE Opioid Overdose Crisis Response Grant Application</b>	
Purpose:	<p>Enhance the capacity of Sedgwick County partners to respond to opioid misuse and overdose through improved prevention efforts. Funds must be used for community-based coordination and development, implementation, and evaluation of activities that address prevention of opioid-related morbidity and mortality. Activities performed under this proposal will benefit prevention of other drug misuse, as well.</p> <p>Proposed activities include the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Perform high-level community needs assessment related to drug misuse, abuse and overdose, focusing on prevention around opioid use disorder and opioid overdose.</li> <li>• Provide trainings for medical providers, other healthcare professionals and others in the community</li> <li>• Implement an evidence-based screening tool at a clinic to identify a patient’s risk for misuse of alcohol and drugs. The risk identified by using the tool determines the action to take by the medical provider for the patient.</li> <li>• Evaluate the effectiveness of the screening tool implementation and the trainings.</li> <li>• Create a toolkit for screening tool implementation in other clinics.</li> <li>• Add mental health partners to the soon-to-be implemented, local Integrated Referral and Intake System (IRIS) software system so that community partners can easily refer individuals to mental health agencies.</li> <li>• Utilize existing local drug misuse data to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Create public facing webpage (DITSS is involved),</li> <li>○ Identify and map overdose “hot spots”,</li> <li>○ Create action plan for prevention.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Collect local drug misuse data from new local partners and develop data sharing and data use agreements.</li> <li>• Learn prevention strategies and best practices by travel for one person to the <i>National Rx Drug Abuse and Heroin Summit</i>, Atlanta, GA, April 22-25, 2019.</li> </ul>
Eligibility:	Kansas Local Health Departments
Utilization:	<p>This funding will be used for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Part time salary for two new part-time temporary positions who will coordinate most of the grant activities: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ A <u><i>Drug Misuse Data Coordinator</i></u> and a <u><i>Drug Misuse Data Assistant</i></u></li> </ul> </li> <li>• Mileage for Data Coordinator and Assistant for in-county travel as needed</li> <li>• Software for webpage creation and for data collection</li> <li>• Operating supplies and printing</li> </ul>

Utilization continued:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Travel for one person to the <i>National Rx Drug Abuse and Heroin Summit</i>, Atlanta, GA, April 22-25, 2019.</li> <li>• Sub-grant award to University of Kansas School of Medicine-Wichita for full coordination of two half-day trainings for medical providers, SBIRT-certified physician trainer, and technical assistance in performing clinical workflow studies.</li> </ul>
Grant Period:	December 1, 2018 - August 31, 2019. One time grant funding opportunity which must be spent by August 31, 2019.
Positions Supported:	<p>Funding from this grant will be used to support the following two new temporary part-time positions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Drug Misuse Data Coordinator</u> (Level 129)*</li> <li>• <u>Drug Misuse Data Assistant</u> (Level 123)*</li> </ul> <p>*Both to work up to 29 hours per week for the period December 9, 2018 through August 31, 2019.</p>
