

**A RESOLUTION APPOINTING MADISON SHRINER TO THE
SEDGWICK COUNTY FOURTH DISTRICT CITIZENS' ADVISORY BOARD**

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 19-101, *et seq.*, the Board of County Commissioners of Sedgwick County, Kansas, ("County") may exercise the powers of home rule to determine its local affairs and government;

WHEREAS, the Sedgwick County Fourth District Citizens' Advisory Board was established by Sedgwick County Resolution 055-2019 which established the terms of membership and whose members are to be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners upon the recommendation of the Fourth District Commissioner;

WHEREAS, a member's term shall continue until any of the following occur: (1) the resignation, incapacity or death of member; (2) the member's removal upon recommendation of the Fourth District Commissioner and a majority vote of the Board of County Commissioners; or (3) the conclusion of the term of office for the Fourth District County Commissioner who recommended the member's appointment; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of County Commissioners to appoint Madison Shriner to the Sedgwick County Fourth District Citizens' Advisory Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SEDGWICK COUNTY, KANSAS, that:

Madison Shriner is hereby appointed to the Sedgwick County Fourth District Citizens' Advisory Board to serve a term effective April 17, 2019.
