Grant Summary and Timeline:

The SFY2017 Kansas Department of Corrections (KDOC) budget includes funding to support the Justice Reinvestment Initiative (HB2170). The purpose of the funding is to enhance and/or develop behavioral health programs / interventions in the community and reduce revocations as a result. Community corrections agencies who received SFY2014 - SFY2016 awards were encouraged to submit a proposal with the intent of sustaining or enhancing strategies that have been implemented. The FY2017 budget includes funding to sustain current positions that provide cognitive skills programming, peer mentoring and mental health strategies proven to reduce recidivism.
